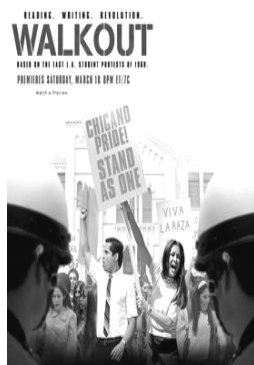
OSAMA (2003) Starting 7pm – Sept 23rd

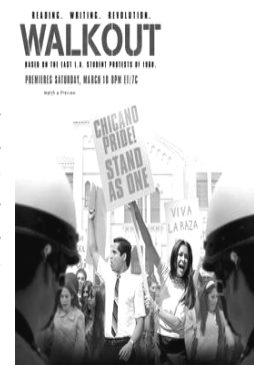
